Sensory Scavenger Hunt



Raised salt painting

MATERIALS

Card stock*

- Squeeze bottle of glue (such as Elmers)
- Table salt

Liquid watercolours or paints

Paint brushes or Droppers

**Any sturdy art surface will do. We've done this with card stock, poster board, cardboard, watercolour paper, paper plates, and foam core.*

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Squeeze glue designs onto your card stock
2. Use your glue to draw a design or picture onto your cardstock.
3. Carefully sprinkle salt onto cardstock until the glue is thoroughly covered. Tip to let excess salt fall away. A baking dish or tray helps to contain the salt.
4. Dip your paint brush into liquid watercolour paint then gently touch to the salt-covered glue lines. Watch the paint "magically" travel in both directions!

If you like, you can use a dropper or pipette instead of a paint brush to add your watercolour paint. We find that this can add a bit too much paint at a time, but I know that many people like this method.

The drying process may take a day or two.

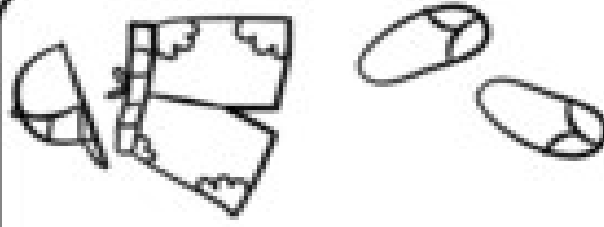

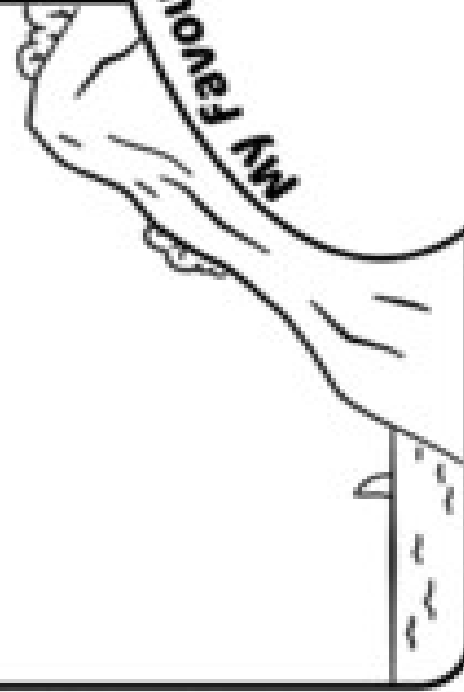

GORGEOUS EMBOSSED Fish Puppets

Printable Template



Supplies To Make Embossed Foil Fish 4mm Thick Twine
Scissors

Glue

Foil

Acrylic Paint

Washing Up Liquid

Jumbo Popsicle Stick

Sticky Tape

1 - Start by cutting a fish template

2 - Cut out pieces of 4mm thick twine or drinking straws and glue them on to your fish templates to make raised patterns. Younger kids can keep it really simple and older kids can create more intricate fish scales and fish fin designs.

3 - Tear off 2 pieces of foil large enough to over lap each fish craft template. Lay the foil on top of your fish craft and starting from the middle and working outwards, gently push the foil into the dips and hollows between your string pieces. Be gentle or the foil may rip.

4 - Turn your foil fish craft over and wrap the foil tightly around the edges onto the back of each fish. Keep it as flat as you can but it doesn't matter if it's messy because it's going to be hidden later.

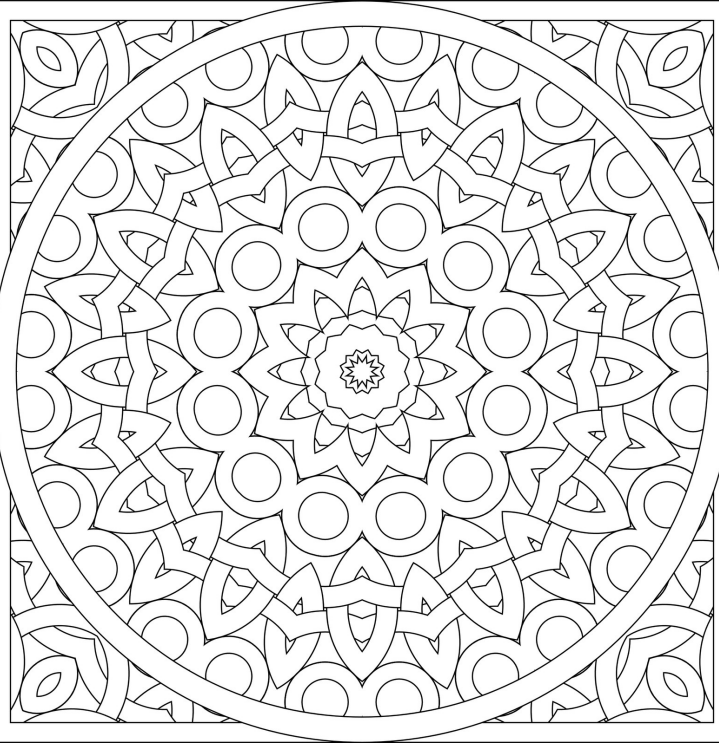
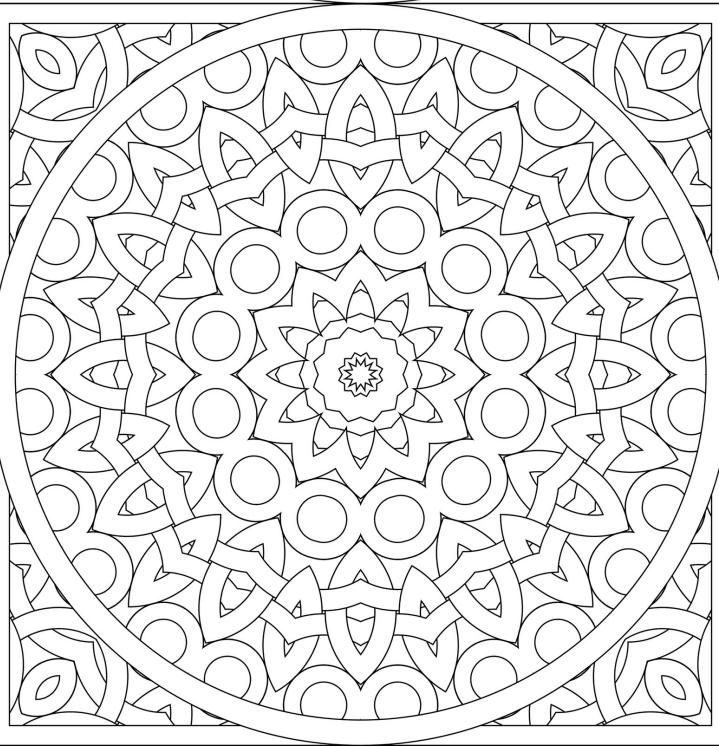
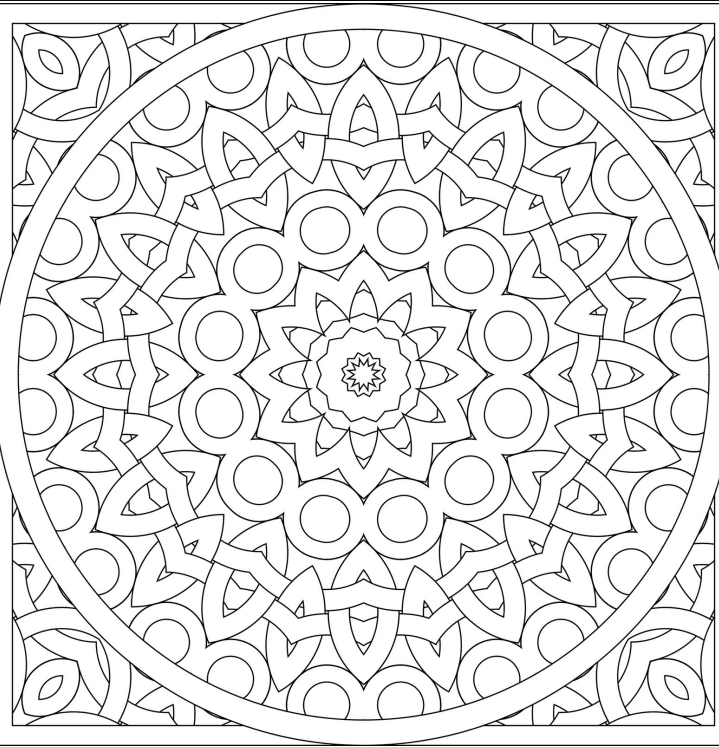
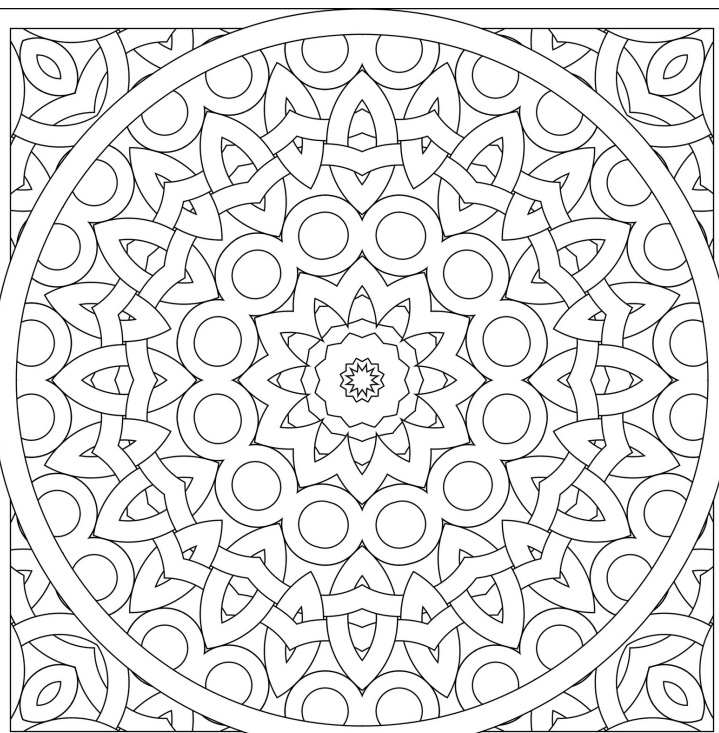
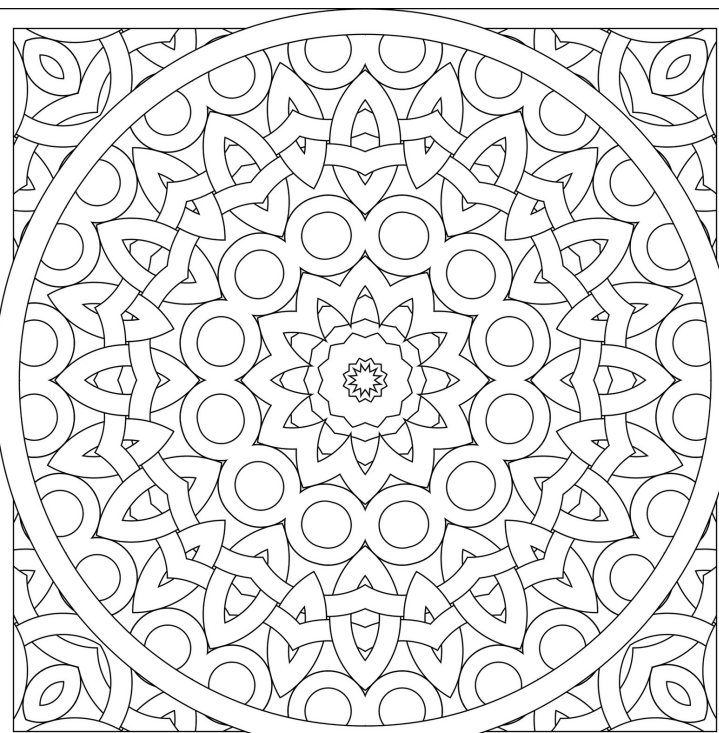
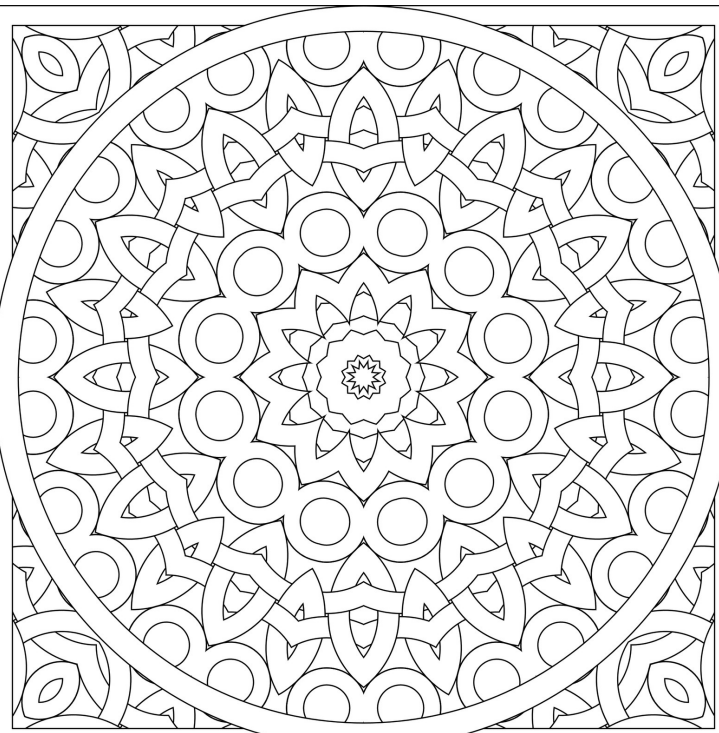
5 - If you are making a fish puppet use sticky tape to attach a jumbo popsicle stick onto the back of one foil fish.

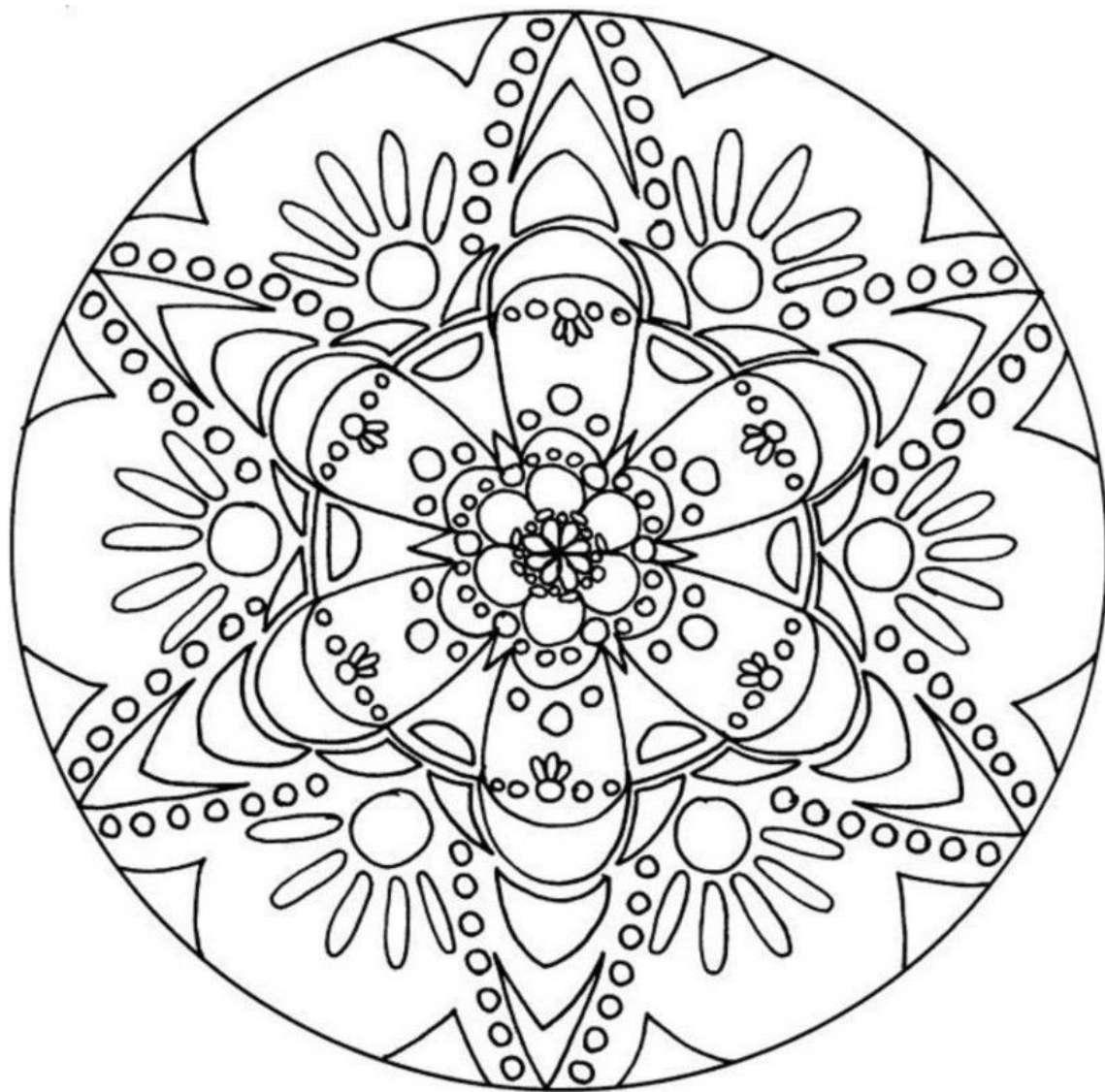
6 - Finish your embossed foil fish puppet by glueing the two fish halves together and painting the lower areas between the string pieces.

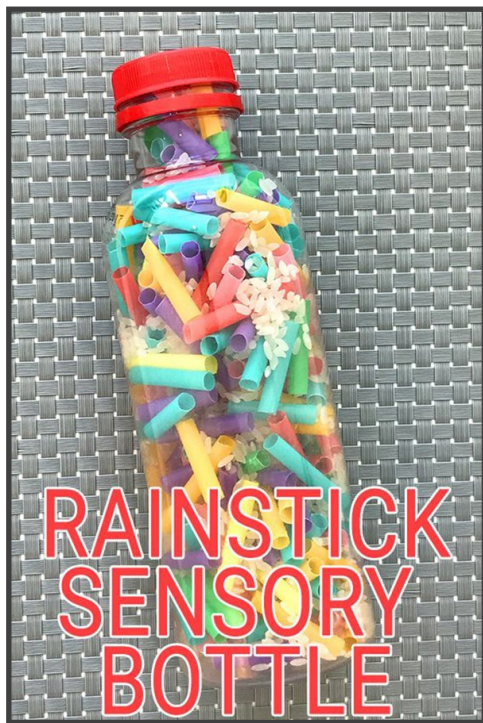
Now your fish puppet craft is double sided so it will look beautiful from all angles as kids swim them around. What a fun foil art project that's great for imaginative play too!





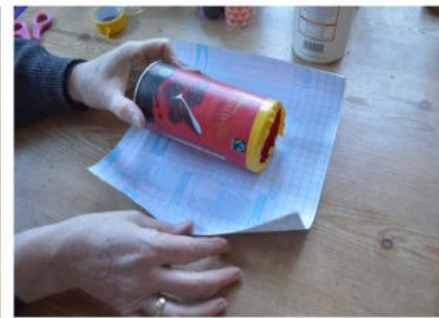






Make your own instruments at home.

Find an empty bottle and fill it with different items. You could use rice, pasta or cornflakes.

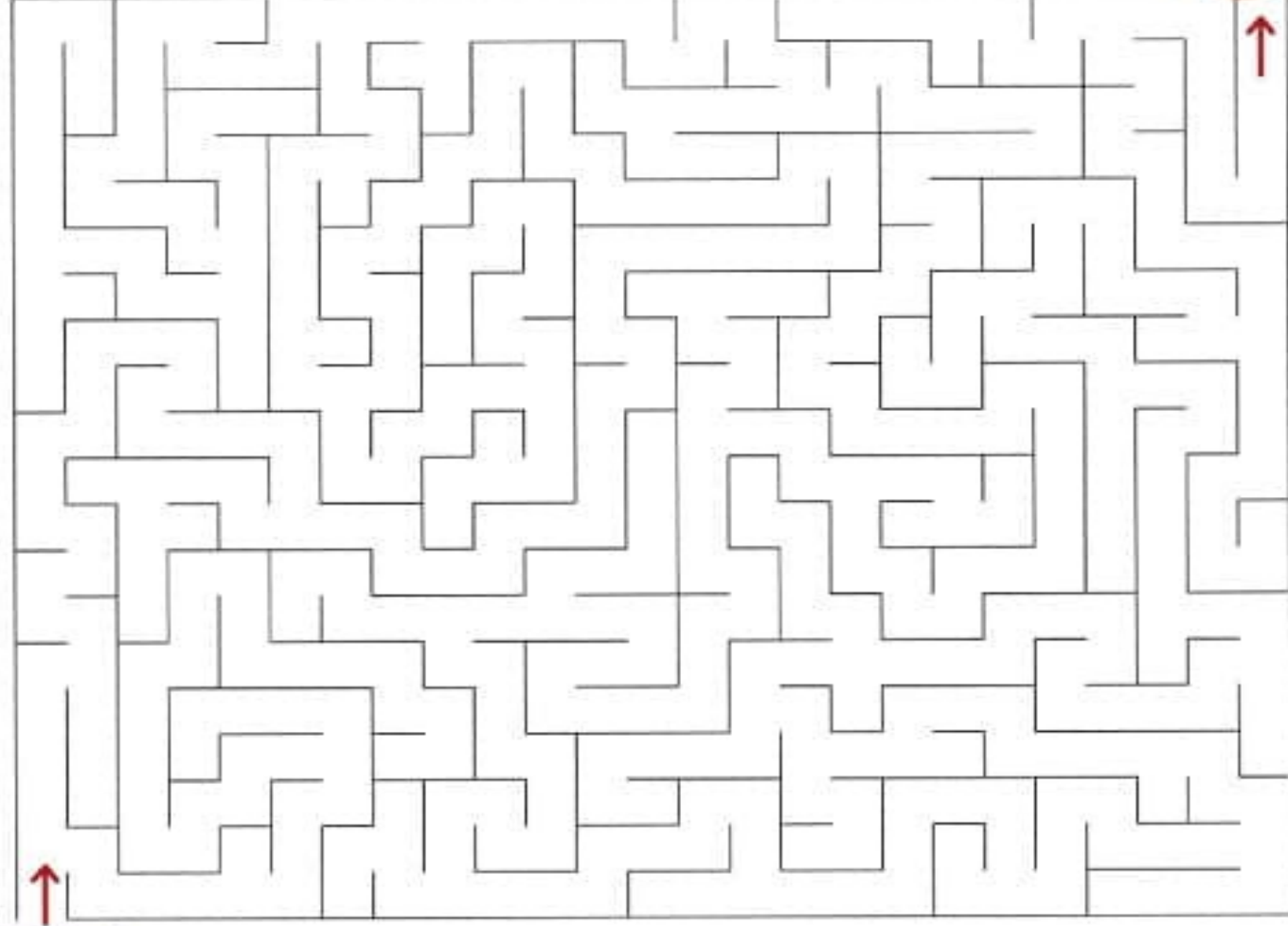


You can decorate the bottle or use paper to wrap it in.
Remember to make sure the lid is secure!

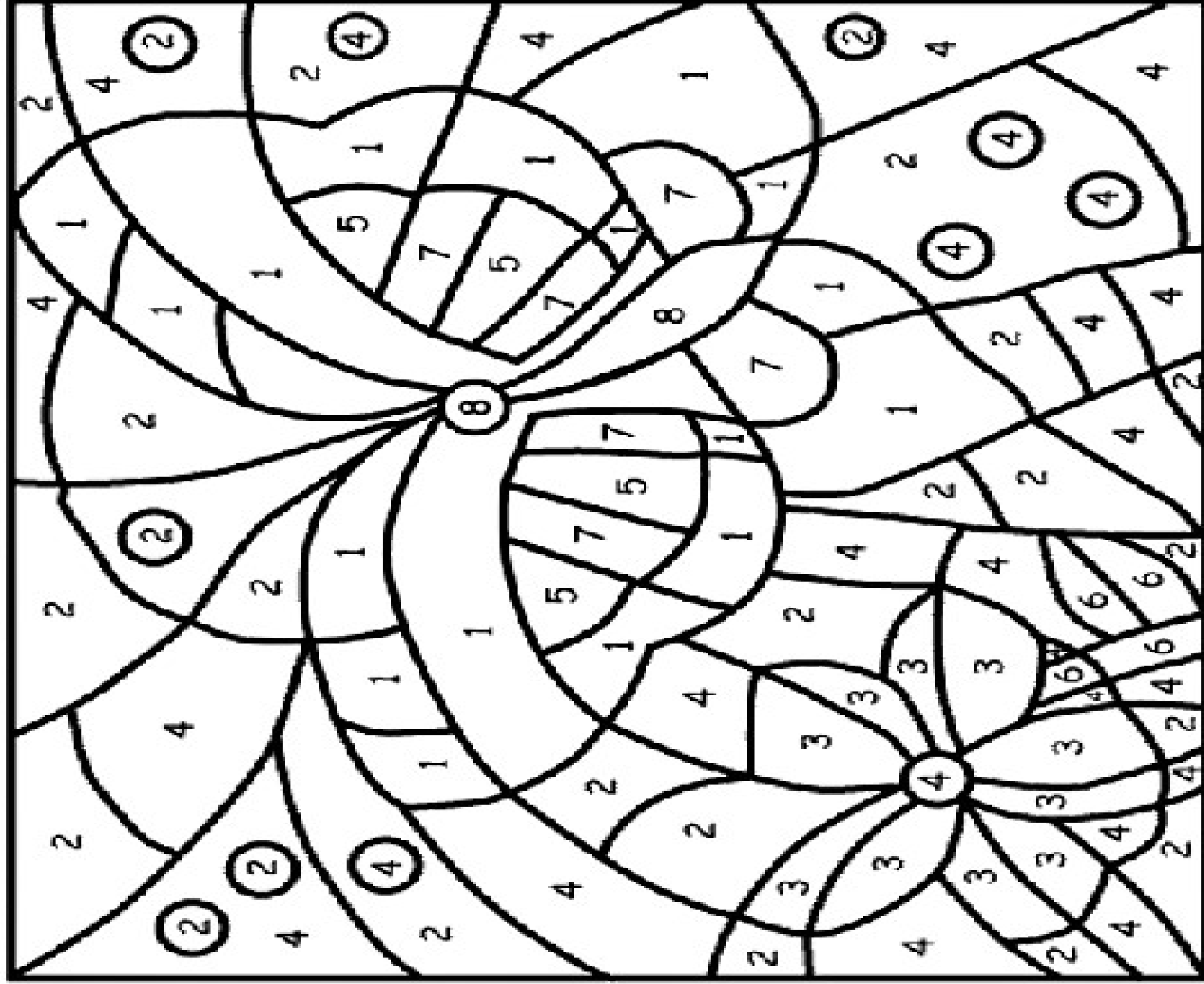
